

Overview of the Substance Use Continuum of Care	A. Drug Medi-Cal Waiver Goals for Drug Medi-Cal Waiver: to improve access to services and health outcomes by formally transforming the system to a continuum of care and to improve quality of care via managed care plan. Providers use the American Society of Addiction (ASAM) assessment and provide individualized care to patients to better serve their needs. Grievance and appeals processes have been made available.

	<ul> <li>B. Overview of Substance Use Continuum of Care Many clients are homeless and/or have mental illness. Waiver now pays for case management services and individual counseling. Crisis residentials not meeting network adequacy on timeliness, especially due to COVID-19. Substance Use Helpline is targeted for Medi-Cal beneficiaries but will still serve regardless. FY18-19 shows that the Asian Pacific Islander and Latinx communities are not being adequately served. Latinx community faces access issues.</li> <li>C. COVID-19 SUD Operations Outpatient services are limiting in-person services and using telehealth and telephone services. Operation Comfort and Safer Ground programs are running. Social isolation is very difficult for those in recovery; SUD is working on a public information campaign to ensure people have the resources to reach out. Residentials have limited patients via physical distancing. Medicine and treatment dosages have increased to allow clients to come in-person less frequently.</li> <li>D. Questions: Dual Diagnosis Treatment All programs are required to be co-occurring capable. Alameda County is developing a curriculum for co-occurring care training.</li> </ul>	C.
