Adult and Older Adult Director's Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Justice involved mental health steering committee and mental health task force formed with goal to drive down the number of people in the forensic system. Two parts: (1) Diversion work group and (2) Data collection and information sharing. Task force gives recommendations to the Steering Committee. Using the Sequential Intercept Model, a model that diverts people with behavioral health disorders from the criminal justice system. It is based on the idea that movement through the system follows a logical sequence, with multiple points to intercept and divert people into mental health and substance abuse services instead. B. Expanding the definition of LPS Conservatorship as it pertains to gravely disabled to include substance abuse. AB1810 Gravely Disabled due to Substance Use Disorder – Four counties with the highest rate of homeless and substance abuse are 	

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	<p>in a pilot program to test out this added category. Less time for persons who are Incompetence to Stand Trial (IST) from 3 years to 2 years</p> <p>C. Second mobile crisis team now established in South County with East County to follow in the near future, exact date unknown.</p>	
Discussion Items	<p>A. Fremont Hospital Incident – Marsha McInnis received correspondence about a psychiatrist who was assaulted while in his car leaving his employment at Fremont Hospital. Crysta Krames of Fremont Hospital relayed their account of the incident. The person who attacked the psychiatrist had planned ahead and appeared psychotic. He was arrested and charged with attempted murder. Injuries were not as serious as conveyed to Ms. McInnis. Unfortunate incident and an isolated case. Area of improvement could be lighting/cameras in the parking lot reaching to the outer parameters of the parking area. No further recommendation noted by the committee.</p>
