| <p><i>Some programs listed in this modality have dedicated capacity for those on AB109 county probation status, indicated with "AB109" in the Specialty Services column. Referrals may be handled one of two ways: (1) if the caller acknowledges they are on probation and are willing to let their Probation Officer know they are seeking treatment, they should be referred to their Probation Officer, who will refer them to Center Point for level of care assessment and placement. If they do not wish their PO to know they are seeking treatment, the screener may refer them directly to any of the programs listed in this modality. The screener should advise the caller that there are sometimes long waiting lists for non-AB109 funded beds, and that accepting a referral back to their Probation Officer, to Center Point and then to program will usually ensure immediate access to services.</i></p> |   |  |   |
