"Do No Harm: Managing Aggressive Behaviors in a Behavioral Health Setting"

This course, adapted from Seneca Family of Agency's Ahimsa Model, was created to train social service providers on how to react when approached by clients who are in crisis. In determining how to respond to individuals when their reactions are unsafe, this model focuses on the concept that each person's experience is unique and must be met with compassion in order to be properly managed. This course takes a deeper look into the social service providers' motivation and understanding of human reactivity so that they are able to meet the needs of clients professionally, while maximizing safety and minimizing risk. Two dates to choose from; one for administrative staff on 6/19/17 and another for clinicians on 6/21/17.
