## Clinical Supervision: The How, What, and Why of it. Training for clinical staff who wish to supervise Associate Clinical Social Workers & MFTIs Presented by Peter Manoleas, LCSW

This course is designed to meet the 15-hour training required for supervising associate social workers (ASWs) as mandated by California regulations. It also meets BBS requirements for persons interested in providing pre-licensure supervision for MFT interns (MFTIs). The course will utilize a combination of PowerPoint presentations, video clips, vignettes, and small and large group discussion.

**Learning Objectives:** Apply knowledge of the different types of supervision to the diversity of supervisor & supervisee relationships represented by participants and their agencies; Identify the California Board of Behavioral Sciences statutes and regulations as they apply to clinical supervision of ASWs and MFTIs; Apply principles of quality supervision to improve clinical outcomes for ACBHCS clients; and more.
