Audience: This course is for clinicians to learn various facets of clinical supervision of master's level behavioral health, unlicensed clinicians. This training is reserved for Alameda County Behavioral Health staff and *contracted* Providers.

Trainers: Dr. Alice LoCicero, PsyD is a board-certified clinical psychologist with over 25 years of experience supervising students, interns, and early career clinicians. Currently, Dr. LoCicero supervises students at The Wright Institute. Previously, she supervised interns and early career psychologists at the Center for Multicultural Training at Boston Medical Center, and other clinical facilities in Boston. Robert Deady, Psy.D is a clinical psychologist, working primarily in supervision and administration of training programs for doctoral students at the Wright Institute (Berkeley). Previously Dr. Deady served as program director for the Wright Institute Sanctuary Project, training and supervising students conducting asylum evaluations with people from Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras. Dr. Deady also maintains a small private practice, with particular interests in working with LGBTQ+ folks and trauma-related issues.

Description: The course is designed for clinicians to learn various facets of clinical supervision. The topics include complex responsibilities, evaluation of intern competence, working with interns with personal and/or professional challenges. Goals are for Supervisors to be able to explain their philosophy of supervision; minimize use of criticism in teaching interns; accurately assess an intern's capacity to become an effective professional; increase an intern's capacity for self-reflection; and effectively engage in and teach self-care principles.

Learning Objectives – *at the end of the training, participants will be able to:*

1. List and describe three different approaches to clinical supervision.
2. List at least two impacts of an intern's apprehension about evaluation.
3. Differentiate the responsibilities of clinical supervisor to the intern, client, and institution.
4. Explain three principles of self-care for interns and supervisors.
5. Identify two supervisory situations where cultural issues and/or issues of generational trauma are salient.

To complete attendance for an ACBH sponsored virtual training, ALL participants must take and achieve a score of at least 70% on the post-test(s).
