Law & Ethics for County Providers: HIPAA, Minor Consent, and 42 CFR Part 2

Audience: Alameda County Public Health Nurses and BHCS SUD Providers

Description: Topics will include a review of new legislation affecting healthcare providers and their clients including new rules affecting licensure and training, access to records, gender issues, mandated reporters, drug prescribing, and involuntary treatment. Also, information will be provided on minor consent and the new 42 CFR Part 2 substance use disorder confidentiality regulations.

Learning Objectives – at the end of the training, participants will be able to:

1. Name two changes in licensing laws that impact healthcare providers' licensing boards or categories of licensees;
2. Describe the category of signers on involuntary certifications and when a second signer can be someone other than the psychiatrist or psychologist who participated in the patient's evaluation;
3. Articulate two ways that state law has changed to address gender issues;
4. State two ways that the state is addressing the opioid crisis to make prescribing and dispensing of Schedule II, III or IV drugs safer;
5. Differentiate between legal capacity, physical capacity, and mental capacity and provide a simple description of each;
6. Explain who decides mental capacity for physical health care, and describe how mental capacity to consent to mental health care has been pre-determined in California by statute; and,
7. Provide three examples of staff behavior that could create "boundary issues" for a client.
